\$4 million in renovations cost taxpayers without benefit of public hearing

Holding a public meeting to answer public's questions

Through its PTAs, Wasatch County School District is promoting character education in our elementaries. These lofty goals of trustworthiness, respect, caring, citizenship, responsibility, and fairness are essential to the formation of productive and upstanding adults in our society.
