




Salary and Benefits




The Community

Wasatch County School District encompasses all of Wasatch County. The District Office is located in Heber City and serves the communities of Heber, Midway, Charleston, Daniel, Hideout, Independence, Timberlakes, and Wallsburg. These communities are experiencing

tremendous growth, yet offer residents a quality of life found only in rural Utah. According to the 2010 U.S. Census, Wasatch County was Utah's fastest growing County with a 55-percent population growth over a ten-year period. In addition to being recognized as one of "America's Hottest Boom Towns," Heber City was singled out as the "Fifth-fastest growing town in America" by Forbes Magazine.







The County is located in the heart of the Wasatch Mountains approximately 60 miles southeast of Salt Lake City and 30 miles east of Provo. The Heber Valley is one of Utah's most picturesque valleys and is home to three state parks, five pristine mountain golf courses, blue-ribbon fishing, a Swiss-themed town, and is surrounded by three major reservoirs: Strawberry, Deer Creek, and Jordanelle. Residents can enjoy hiking, fishing, golfing, camping, boating, water skiing, snow skiing, and snowmobiling all within minutes of our communities.

The County is home to annual community events such as Wasatch County Fair Days, Mountain Valley Stampede, Midway Swiss Days, Heber Valley Western & Cowboy Poetry Gathering, Soldier Hollow Classic Sheep Dog Championship, and many more.

The District

There are currently seven schools which serve the students in our district. Grades K-4 attend Heber Valley, J.R. Smith, Midway and Old Mill Elementary Schools. Grades 5-6 attend Timpanogos Intermediate School. Grades 7-8 attend Rocky Mountain Middle School, and grades 9-12 attend Wasatch High School. We also have the North Campus, an excellent alternative high school that allows for full-time or dual enrollment. All the facilities are well-maintained and meet the most stringent seismic requirements. The District passed a bond election in November 2015 and is currently constructing an elementary school, a middle school, and a new pool




facility. The grades and schools will then be reconfigured to have five elementary schools (K-5), two middle schools (6-8), and one high school (9-12).

The District provides excellent and innovative educational opportunities for all of its students. Among these opportunities are a 50/50 Spanish Dual Language Immersion program that provides students with the core academics in two languages and a Digital Conversion program that provides each student with a digital device and corresponding digital curriculum. The District has an excellent Special Education program, and also provides counseling services, music and arts programs, gifted and talented programs, and fitness programs in each elementary school as well as the secondary schools. The teachers have been highly involved in Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) for many years with emphasis on student achievement. The District enjoys a great relationship with its licensed and classified employees, parents, community members, and various organizations and greatly values each

person's contributions to the educational process.
