Often times we receive questions from an applicant or agent prior to their submission with their delineation/permit request still in draft form, but as soon as the information is submitted to our office we consider the material to be in its final form. That being said, we almost never receive a delineation or permit request that we consider 'complete' in its first submission. Because our Regulatory Program has such strict and specific guidelines, we conduct a completeness determination and 9/10 times will need to contact the applicant & agent to request additional information. I hope that answers your question.
