

Utah Code 63A-1-201 to -206

- Website administered by OSA
- Permits Utah taxpayers to view, understand, and track use of taxpayer dollars
- Makes public financial information available on Internet without paying a fee






HealthCost.utah.gov

- Historically, no easy way for most Utah patients and providers to find the price of or expected payment amount for healthcare procedures before receiving care
- Launched a web-based tool to compare the cost of various medical procedures by provider
 - Help consumers make more informed healthcare decisions

Bottom Up, Not Top Down Student Level Expenditure








- Financial audits are conducted in accordance with:

 - Single Audit Act




- Approximately 80 reports issued annually

 - 55 Letters to Management, Attestation Reports, and Other Reports



















Cost of Auditing Trend

 - Approximately 500 Conservation, Health, Housing, Interlocal, Local, and Special Service Districts





State Privacy Officer

Responsibilities:

- Analyze & report on government privacy practices
- Provide educational & training materials
- Identify privacy practices that pose the greatest risk to individual privacy & prioritize those privacy practices for review
- Respond to requests from individuals to review a designated government entity's privacy practice
- Make privacy recommendations to State Legislature
