### GENERAL FUNCTION

The Principal of a school is responsible for providing leadership and direction in all matters pertaining to the educational programs and practices of the school, including the operation of the school and the proper involvement of parents and community members in the planning and decision making process.

- The incumbent is responsible to follow all policies and guidelines as detailed by District policy.

### ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Develop, implement and manage appropriate school and assigned District budgets to provide fiscal accountability.
- Assist in the preparation and presentation of reports and recommendations to the Board of Education (Board) regarding the activities of the administrative area of the District and to assist in responding to the requests of the Board as required.
- Provide leadership and direction in all matters relating to the educational programs and practices of the school, including:
  - o Keeping abreast of trends and developments in curriculum and instruction.
  - o Determining educational needs.
  - o Supervising the implementation of instructional programs.
  - o Maintaining the effectiveness of instructional and administrative

- o Developing, implementing and supervising instructional programs.
- Provide leadership and direction to the operation and activities of the local schools and to comply with Board goals, policies and guidelines.
- Implement the District system for properly assessing and reporting pupil progress to parents.
- Manage the development and implementation of appropriate programs to maintain appropriate student behavior and discipline.
- Administer enrollment and attendance policies and procedures and establish and maintain proper student records.
- Disseminate and interpret information to employees and media concerning the programs and activities of the local school and to respond to community problems and concerns as required.
- Implement, in support of the District-wide program, a systematic approach to public relations and communication with the community and District employees.
- Provide professional leadership to the community in educational matters and to effectively use parent and community volunteers and ad hoc parent advisory committees.
- Provide leadership and direction in implementing the personnel policies and programs that pertain to the staff of the local school. Assist the Human Resource Department in the employment and/or discipline of school personnel.
- Provide leadership and direction in the implementation of a comprehensive staff development program for personnel of the local school.
- Develop and implement policies, guidelines and procedures for the effective utilization of the physical facilities of the school.
- Manage the reproduction, distribution, utilization and inventorying of instructional related materials. Follow District procurement guidelines.
- Establish, maintain and protect records and required information in a secure location. Maintain confidentiality of all student and employee information.
- Assist in the development of school boundaries and the coordination of the assignment of students to schools.
- Implement and monitor Federal/State programs and projects to ensure compliance.
- Develop, implement and evaluate short and long-range planning procedures, utilizing appropriate management systems and accountability procedure within the schools.
- Represent the District at local, State and national meetings and participate in professional organizations where appropriate.
- Will be required to attend meetings, events and activities outside of normal work hours on a regular basis.
- Required to travel to District schools or other locations using own transportation.
- This position requires punctual and regular daily attendance at assigned location.

The Wasatch County School District Board of Education announces the following J.R. Smith and Old Mill elementary school principal appointments for the upcoming school year. The appointments have been made following a rigorous process that included multiple interviews involving two dozen internal and external candidates for the positions. These will also fill vacancies at the two elementary schools created by the districtwide administrative changes announced earlier this spring.

Mrs. LaNay King has been given the assignment to lead Old Mill Elementary School, and Mr. Alex Judd has been selected as the principal of J.R. Smith Elementary School.

"Elementary school principals are crucial to our focus on early childhood and elementary education as the cornerstone of lifelong educational, personal, and professional success for our students," said Superintendent Paul Sweat. "After years of concerted effort, we have been successful in raising our achievement outcomes at the elementary level and are confident these two talented individuals will continue that trajectory at their respective schools."

A 16-year veteran of WCSD, Mrs. LaNay King has been an assistant principal at Wasatch High School and the administrator at Wasatch Alternative High School for the past two years. Prior to joining the administrative team at Wasatch High School, Mrs. King served as Literacy Coach at Rocky Mountain Middle School and as a 5<sup>th</sup> grade teacher at Heber Valley Elementary. She earned a Bachelor of Arts in American Studies and an M. Ed in Educational Leadership from Brigham Young University, and an M. Ed in Education from Southern Utah University. A native of Orem, Mrs. King graduated from Orem High School.

"LaNay King is extremely hard working, dedicated and loves building community wherever she goes," said WCSD Director of Elementary Education, Stephanie Discher. "She has very high expectations for herself and motivates others to do the same. She has an amazing growth mindset and is the right person to help Old Mill Elementary continue its tradition of excellence."

Mr. Alex Judd joins Wasatch from Provo City School District where he has served as an assistant superintendent for the past nine years supervising 13 elementary schools and principals. During his 22 years in education, Mr. Judd has worked as a classroom teacher, administrative intern, instructional coach, assistant principal, and building principal. He holds an Associate of Science in Humanities from Utah Valley University, a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education and Special Education from Southern Utah University and a Master of Education in Administration and Supervision from Brigham Young University.

Taking the helm as Wasatch Alternative High School Director will be Amanda Edwards. Mrs. Edwards joins Wasatch from Jordan School District (JSD), where she served as an elementary school principal for the past eight years, most recently at Bastian Elementary. During her 20 years in education, Mrs. Edwards has worked as an elementary school teacher and assistant principal at the elementary and middle school levels. A resident of Heber City, she is a graduate of the University of Wyoming where she earned her Bachelor of Arts in Elementary Education and an

Administration and Supervision endorsement in Educational Leadership. Mrs. Edwards also holds a Master of Education in Elementary Education and ESL from Southern Utah University.
